



**Judgement**

That the present Marriage Petition has been jointly filed by the Petitioner No-01/ Wife and Petitioner No-02/ Husband under Section 13B of the Hindu Marriage Act for the relief of dissolution of the Hindu marriage between the parties solemnized on dated 19-02-2018.


Briefly, the facts of the application are that the marriage of the petitioners was solemnized on dated 19-02-2018 as per Hindu rituals. After marriage, the petitioners lived together as husband and wife. After marriage, mutual differences arose between the petitioners and it was not possible for both of them to live with each other like husband and wife. The petitioners will settle the pending cases on the basis of settlement. Petitioner No-1 has received all her Stridhan from Petitioner No-2. Petitioner No-1 will receive a total maintenance of Rs. 5 lakh 50 thousand out of which she will receive a DD of Two Lacs Fifty Thousand at the time of statement and will receive Rs 50,000 in cash. Petitioner No- 1 is living SM-9,A-105,Tushar Aptt.,Ext-II,Shalimar Garden,Sahibabad,Ghaziabad(U.P.)-201005,INDIA

separately in her maternal house since October 2019. That's why neither any conversation took place nor was any physical relationship established between the passengers. The differences between the petitioners have increased to such an extent that it is impossible for them to live happily with each other. The petitioners voluntarily decided to dissolve the marriage between them without any pressure. The petitioners have been living separately since the month of October 2019 and want to dissolve the marital relationship with mutual consent. There is no collusion between the petitioners.

Thereafter, affidavit 11A was filed by Petitioner No. - 01 and affidavit 12A was filed by Petitioner No.- 02. And the Petitioner No-01 has further supported the averments of the petition presented in the affidavit filed before the court and has stated that my marriage was solemnized on dated 19-02-2018 with the Petitioner No-02 as per Hindu rituals. After marriage, mutual differences started between both of us. Due to which it was not possible for both of us to live together as husband and wife. Petitioner No-2 has given the balance amount which is received by Petitioner No-1. The petitioners do not owe anything to each other. Both of us have made an agreement to live separately with mutual consent without any pressure. We both have presented this petition before the court with our consent.

Petitioner No-02 has also supported the facts of the petition and the statement of Petitioner-01 in the affidavit statement filed before the court and has stated that my marriage was solemnized with the Petitioner No-01 on dated 19-02-2018. It was not possible to live together because of mutual differences between us since marriage. The respected people of the society have conducted an agreement between both of us to live separately. We both do not have any transaction between us left now and will not be in future. Both of us have presented this petition before the court with mutual consent. We will not have any objection if our marriage is dissolved.

Petitioners are present in the Court today and has stated that they wants to dissolve the marriage concluded between them on dated 19.02.2018 on the basis of the mutual consent.

Thus it is clear that the marriage solemnized between the petitioners and their relationship as husband and wife is not possible to continue in future which he wants to get severed with mutual consent.


Therefore, by accepting the said petition Section 13B Hindu Marriage Act, the marriage between the petitioners is liable to be dissolved.

The Marriage Petition [REDACTED] Hindu Marriage Act on the basis of mutual consent by the Petitioners is accepted.


The Hindu marriage dated [REDACTED] solemnized between the petitioners is declared dissolved on the basis of mutual consent of the Petitioners.


